TUITION, EDUCATION, AND TEXTBOOK AMOUNTS CERTIFICATE – FLYING SCHOOL OR CLUB

- Issue this form to a student who was 16 years of age or older before the end of the year to certify eligibility for the tuition, education, and textbook amounts for courses at a Canadian flying school or club certified by the Minister of Human Resources and Social Development.
- Tuition fees must be more than \$100. Claims for private licence instruction will only be considered if claimed with tuition fees for a commercial-level course or certified as in pursuit of an occupational skill.
- You can claim a **full-time education amount** if you were enrolled in a qualifying educational program as a full-time student. Such a program lasts at least 3 consecutive weeks and requires a minimum of 10 hours of course instruction or work each week in the program (excluding study time). You can claim a **part-time education amount** if you were enrolled in a specified educational program. Such a program lasts at least 3 consecutive weeks and requires a minimum of 12 hours of course instruction each month in the program.
- Eligible tuition fees include the cost of dual and solo flying hours under direction or supervision that are required to obtain applicable licences or ratings and are an integral part of a course of study, up to the minimum flight training requirements of Transport Canada. Eligible tuition fees do **not** include costs or other fees incurred that relate to the use of an aircraft to get flying experience over and above the minimum hours required to obtain your rating or licence.

- If you want to transfer unused tuition, education, and textbook amounts to a designated individual, complete Part 4 of this form.

Part 4 – Student's authorization to transfer tuition, education, and textbook amounts

- You can transfer your unused current-year tuition, education, and textbook amounts to **one** designated individual. That individual can be either your spouse or common-law partner, your parent or grandparent, or your spouse's or common-law partner's parent or grandparent. You cannot transfer your unused current-year amounts to your parent or grandparent, or your spouse's or common-law partner's parent or grandparent, if your spouse or common-law partner claims the "spouse or common-law partner amount" or "amounts transferred from your spouse or common-law partner" on his/her tax return.
- If you transfer unused amounts to your spouse or common-law partner, he or she has to complete **federal Schedule 2**, *Federal Amounts Transferred From Your Spouse or Common-Law Partner*, and, if he or she resided in a province or territory other than Quebec on December 31, **provincial** or **territorial Schedule (S2)**.
